Value of the estate of Thz Fo Farm, prominent Honolulu corporation executive who died on November 30, 1943, is set at \$292,932.86, as of the date of his death, in an appraisal filed in circuit court today.

The appraisers were Francis Evans, Jen Fui Moo and J. D. Marques.

Into futile attempts to recapture vital Hill 112 and the road junction to the northeast.

The Germans were slowly giving ground at both ends and the middle of the front under relentless pressure of American and British Canadian forces.

Lt. Gen. Omar Bradley, head of the American forces, sent assault troops over the top north of St. Lo in a new attack aimed at the core of the entire transport network below the Cherbourg peninsula.

Front dispatches said the Americans made initial gains of several hundred yards. The Nazi line began to sag at numerous points between La Haye Du Puits and Caen but fighting everywhere was very fierce and the enemy was yielding ground only when it had no other alternative.

U. S. forces captured six towns and villages scattered all along the

The inventory shows Mr. Farm held shares of stock in numerous island corporations, the largest single items being 3,216 shares in the Service Cold Storage Co., appraised at \$64,320, and 1,007 shares in the Liberty Auto Shop, appraised at \$18,126.

Mr. Farm also held two demand notes, each for \$10,000 with interest at 7 per cent, from the Service Cold Storage Co., of which he was president and manager. The notes were dated June 12, 1943, and June 29, 1943, respectively.

Fifteen checks found on Mr. Farm's person at the time of his death, amounted to \$6,525.57. Cash on deposit to his credit totaled \$13,042.79.

In addition, the estate includes several purchase money mortgages, agreements of sale, notes and accounts receivable, an eighth interest in a copartnership, the Jewel Box, appraised at \$5,000; a leasehold, accrued rents, an automobile valued at \$278, and several pieces of real estate and improvements.

The real estate includes eight pieces in Honolulu, one piece in Kaneohe and nine acres of summer lots at Oloa, Hawaii.
